



Educational Formats for FLEX Degrees

- **Accelerated On-Campus Courses**

Required classroom time is shortened to six to eight weeks because students do much of the learning on their own. Accelerated programs cover the same content as traditional programs but in a condensed timeframe, usually one or two nights per week. Completion of multiple classes each semester allows you to still finish your degree in two to four years. You communicate with the instructor in person.

- **Online Learning**

Learn and study at various hours throughout the day and on weekends when it is convenient for you. Online programs are delivered via the Internet. A computer with Internet access and an e-mail account is required. Communication with instructors is done via e-mail.

- **Blended Learning**

Blended programs are a combination of online, interactive video conferencing (IVC) and traditional. Coursework is completed both online and in the classroom. A computer with Internet access and an e-mail account is required. Classroom learning happens either in a classroom at one site or at up to three different sites using the IVC system.

- **Traditional On-Campus**

Traditional courses are normally 16 weeks and are instructor led on campus.
