

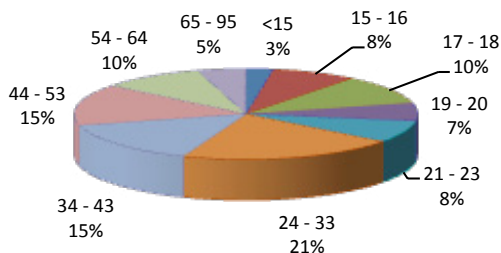

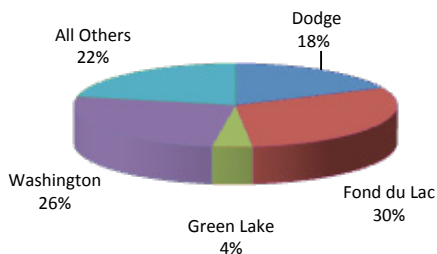

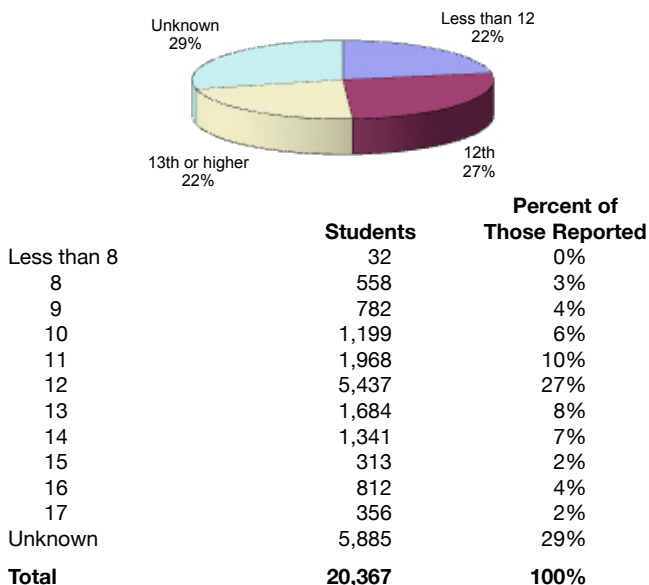

Unduplicated headcount excludes: incarcerated population or delegate agencies (Loc. 35, 36, 37, 50, 51). Client file excludes course activity for aid types of 3, 6, 89 or non-FTE generating courses or activities such as internal MPTC staff courses and community courses like painting, ceramics, etc. Client file also excludes course withdrawals of 80% and 100% and grades of X, Z & O.

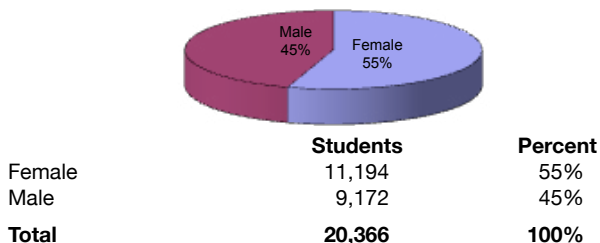

By Highest Grade Completed*

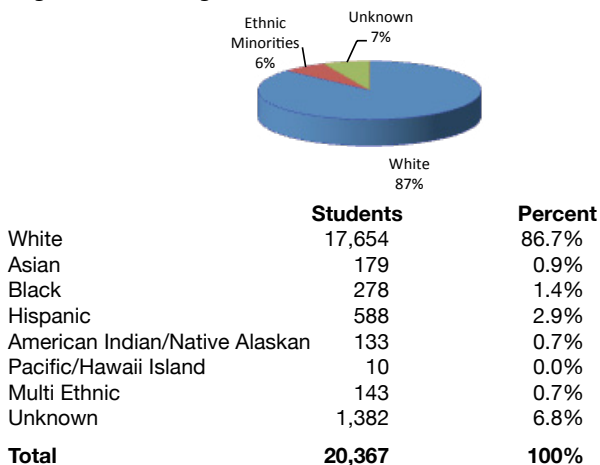


By Gender*
