



By Student Age Demographics*







By County of Student Residence*







Unduplicated enrollment for demographic breakouts includes other counties, out-of-state, transcripted credit high school students, students who took at least one FTE generating course, and Basic Ed students. Unduplicated headcount excludes: incarcerated population or delegate agencies (Loc. 35, 36, 37, 50, 51). Client file excludes course activity for aid types of 3, 6, 89 or non-FTE generating courses or activities such as internal MPTC staff courses and community courses like painting, ceramics, etc. Client file also excludes course withdrawals of 80% and 100% and grades of X, Z & O.

^{**}FTE Generating Headcount includes everyone taking at least one FTE generating course but excludes transcripted credit high school students and those only receiving grant services, but not enrolled.
