Dual Enrollment isn't just smart—it's powerful. Ready to take your future to the next level? Here are the next steps.

DUAL ENROLLMENT OPTIONS

There are two primary ways to earn dual enrollment credits:

DUAL CREDIT START COLLEGE NOW

Dual Enrollment course credits can be applied to a wide range of Career Academies, including Entrepreneurship, Pre-Health, Manufacturing and more. Individual courses with a self-pay option are available if Dual Enrollment courses aren't offered at local high schools.

OPTION 1: DUAL CREDIT COURSES

9th through 12th grade high school students take classes at their high school during the school day and earn college credits from high school teachers who are certified to teach college-level courses. Common course areas include:

HIGH SCHOOL CAREER ACADEMIES

Each Career Academy is a set of courses focused on a specific career area, such as Business, IT, Health Care or Manufacturing.

Complete all required courses within a Career Academy to earn the corresponding Moraine Park certificate or technical diploma.

ACADEMIES

Emergency Medical Technician Academy

Prepares students to handle emergencies—from car accidents to heart attacks—and safely transport patients to medical care. National EMT licensure can be obtained through this opportunity.

Entrepreneur Academy

Build skills to think like a business owner—and prepare for a future in business development, planning, customer service, financial management and more.

Fire Protection Technician Academy

Discover the basics of fire protection—and obtain the Firefighter 1 Certification through this hands-on experience.

Office Software Specialist Academy

Build business-focused skills—with an emphasis on software applications and end-user support functions.

Payroll Assistant Academy

Enhance business and accounting skills by mastering wage calculations, net pay, learning applicable state and federal rules and laws and more.

Pre-Health Academy

Jumpstart a health care career with foundational courses that build essential skills and knowledge. Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) certification can be obtained through this opportunity.

Phlebotomist/Specimen Processor Academy

Learn how to collect samples for lab testing, diagnosis, blood donation and more—all essential parts of accurate medical care.

Robotics, Engineering and Manufacturing (REM) – Manufacturing Fundamentals Academy

Learn and apply basic engineering principles and technical skills to identify and resolve manufacturing challenges.
